**ORDINANCE 16-06**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF JACKSON, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY ESTABLISHING THE SALARY RANGE FOR ALL OF THE VARIOUS OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR THE YEAR 2006 AND THEREAFTER**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Council of the Township of Jackson, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** For the year 2006 and for each year thereafter, the salary range set forth in Schedule "A", which is annexed thereto and is made a part thereof, are hereby established for the officials and employees whose titles are set forth therein.

**SECTION 2.** The provisions of this Ordinance shall be effective for the year 2006 and for each year thereafter except as may be amended or supplemented by subsequent ordinances.

**SECTION 3.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4.** If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to that section, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged, and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed to be valid and effective.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN**, that the foregoing ordinance was introduced and passed on first reading at a regular meeting of the Township Council of the Township of Jackson, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey, held on July 11, 2006 and will be considered for second reading and final passage at the regular meeting of said Township Council to be held on July 25, 2006 at 7:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as this matter can be reached, at the meeting room of the Municipal Building in said Township at which time all persons interested shall be given an opportunity to be so heard concerning this ordinance. 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**DISCUSSION AGENDA:**

**Mark Seda** thanked everyone for coming out July 1<sup>st</sup> and it was a wonderful event. He thanked the School Board who helped a great deal, Shop Rite, Signature Deli, and the efforts behind the scenes from all the people that help support the change of government and making the event what it was.

**William Santos**-stated he enjoys brief meetings and had nothing to add.

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**PUBLIC HEARING, ANY TOPIC**

**KATHY MUELLER-500 BEGONIA COURT:** She introduced herself as the President of the Jackson Women of Today and regretted missing the last meeting where Stephanie Brown accepted a generous check from the Mayor's Cup Golf Tournament which they were very grateful for. She added that most people only know the organization for the Food Pantry that serves the community and provides needed food to seniors and children as well as allow high school students to get community service hours. She invited all members of the Council to come the fourth Thursday of every month to see a distribution or to arrange a personal tour with her at their convenience. She thanked them for the use of the building and refrigerators and stated it was a perfect place to have the food pantry because of the shelves and it was perfectly located and hoped they will allow them to continue using the building. Council Vice President Updegrave agreed it was a wonderful organization and asked Ms. Mueller to send her notification of their meetings. Ms. Mueller explained they meet the second Monday at the Knights of Columbus on Bartley Road.

**MR. GERARD-14 RYE COURT-**He congratulated the Council on their election win and explained he was there to speak about the situation on Rye Court and offered a solution to have one member of the Council assigned to Rye Court to talk to the homeowners and communicate with the builder. Mayor Seda addressed his concerns stating he recently met with the builder and Lennar is working on replacing the trees and he hoped the problems would be resolved in the next couple weeks. He also addressed the drainage issue that he would personally take a look at it and added the Township is still holding the bonds until issues are addressed.

**JOSEPH BRILL-100 MURIFIELD ROAD-**He welcomed the new Mayor and Council and asked about Westlake Mews, affordable housing and the back gate issues. Mayor Seda provided the new Council members with some background information. Council President Stallone informed Mr. Brill they are aware of the situation and would address it with the Affordable Housing Attorney and as for the gate he will speak to the Township Engineer. Mayor Seda stated they needed to follow procedures regardless of any negative impact or fine to the Township explaining it takes more than a day to fix. President Stallone assured him they would sit down with the attorney and figure out what they can do for the residents at Westlake.

**TERRY REIMANN-30 DOUGLAS DRIVE-**She congratulated everyone then she asked Mayor Seda if he was going to be part time or full time. He explained his job isn't a nine to five job and if a resident called him at 7:30am or 7:30pm he would be happy to speak with them. She addressed the new website and asked if agenda and minutes would be put on line? Mayor Seda stated they are working on it along with many things and it will take a little time but they will get to it.

**GEORGE FISHER-84 BOWMAN ROAD**-He congratulated everyone and wished them good luck. He reminded the Council on Monday the 17th the first of the 1700 homes would be heard at Grawtown Estates and that they were turned down in the past and now they are back again. There have been other developments and plans that have come through in that area that have come under question concerning environmental issues along with traffic, schools, taxes, etc. but he was mainly addressing the environmental issues. Assemblymen Dancer and Malone and Senator Singer have introduced legislation to the Pinelands regarding their environmental concerns in the Pinelands area. In March of 05 the Committee introduced Ordinance 07-06. In that Ordinance, section 109-169 it was specifically written to question the environmental experts the developers pay to get the answers they want. Some recent developments that were approved by the Planning Board are now in question regarding environmental issues. The section in 07-06 allows the Township to verify the information around environmental concerns. He asked if they knew when it will be implemented and what was going on with it right now? Mayor Seda stated the new attorney would be brought up to speed on Ordinance 07-06 and from that point the Planning Board Engineer would look at it along with the Township Planner. There is a good chance the application would not be heard at the next meeting because of the information they need to review. Mayor Seda stated he would ask the current professionals to contact the past professionals to see what's been done and where it sits. Council President Stallone confirmed (for the public's edification) that George Fisher is a Township representative to the Pinelands Commission and wanted to express his appreciation for the time he spends as such.

**BARBARA SPIELMAN-37 SHOAL ROAD**-She welcomed the Mayor and members of the Council and introduced herself as a representative for the Women's Club at Westlake and wanted to thank them all for their continued support with the Women's Club annual Walk For The Cure they hold yearly and explained because of last years show of support they will take their walk town wide this year. The walk is scheduled for Sunday, October 8<sup>th</sup> at Johnson Park. They are in the process of updating their website and will get entry forms out as soon as possible.
