## Mayor Reina Announces Energy Rebate programs available throughout the State of New Jersey

Mayor Michael Reina announced today that a \$75 Mail-in Rebate on Select ENERGY STAR® Qualified Clothes Washers is available from New Jersey's Clean Energy Program

New Jersey's Clean Energy Program is rewarding customers who purchase the most efficient ENERGY STAR qualified models.

- For a limited time only, get \$75 back from New Jersey's Clean Energy Program on the purchase of eligible ENERGY STAR qualified clothes washers.
- Clothes washers eligible for a \$75 mail-in rebate have a **Modified Energy Factor (MEF) of 2.2 or higher**. In addition to having a minimum MEF of 2.2, all select clothes washers must be listed by the EPA as ENERGY STAR qualified. Make sure the model you purchase has an MEF of 2.2 or higher.
- The MEF measures energy consumption of the total laundry cycle (washing and drying). It indicates how many cubic feet of laundry can be washed and dried with one kWh of electricity; the higher the number, the greater the efficiency.

In order to apply for the \$75 mail-in rebate, the following program guidelines apply:

- Applicant must be a customer of one of the following electric or gas utilities: Atlantic City Electric; Jersey Central Power & Light; PSE&G Electric; Rockland Electric Company, New Jersey Natural Gas, Elizabethtown Gas, PSE&G Gas, South Jersey Gas.
- Valid for select ENERGY STAR qualified clothes washers purchased between now and December 31, 2010 (Customers who purchased a clothes washer in 2009 have until January 31, 2010 to apply for the 2009 rebate).
- The 2009 clothes washer application may be used to apply for a 2010 rebate.
- Rebate request must be accompanied by proof of purchase (legible copy of dated and itemized sales receipt. Purchased item must be listed on sales receipt).
- Rebate request must include manufacturer, ENERGY STAR model number, serial number, store

name, store location, purchase date, and purchase price.

- Limit one rebate per customer for purchases under this program.
- Unit must be installed in New Jersey.
- Offer limited to new products only.
- Rebates are subject to available funds.
- Customers of municipal electric utilities do not qualify for a rebate.

This program promotes responsible recycling of refrigerators and freezers in New Jersey and offers a \$50 cash incentive. Recycling your old refrigerator/freezer is easy, and you can earn money too. It's simple. Here's how...

- To arrange for a free pick up of your old refrigerator/freezer call 877-270-3520 or schedule online at JACO Environmental.
- Get \$50 cash back for recycling responsibly once your transaction is processed.
- Save up to \$150 a year on energy costs by recycling an old fridge.

To Participate in this Initiative:

- You must be a New Jersey resident and a customer of Atlantic City Electric, Jersey Central Power & Light, PSE&G, or Rockland Electric Company.
- You must own the refrigerator or freezer being recycled.
- Your refrigerator or freezer must be between 10 and 30 cubic feet in size.
- Refrigerator and freezer must be in working condition.
- Limit two units per residential address.
- Restrictions may apply.
- Incentives are processed within 90-120 days.
- Customers of municipal electric utilities do not qualify.

Energy and Environmental Facts:

- On average a newer refrigerator or freezer consumes 1,000 fewer kilowatt-hours annually than a refrigerator or freezer manufactured before 1990.
- Recycling 20,000 older refrigerators or freezers will result in energy savings equal to the amount of power used in approximately 1,400 homes annually.
- Recycling 20,000 older refrigerators or freezers would result in the avoidance of CO2 emissions equal to removing 40,000 cars from the road for one year.
